



Key Features:

SharePoint sites can be restored to a new SharePoint site

You can now restore a SharePoint site or subsite as a new site with a new URL. The new site will exist in parallel with the existing source site and will not overwrite the original one. This option can be especially useful when you have a damaged site that you want to recreate, but are not ready to lose access to the data that is currently in SharePoint.

This new feature works for all types of sites, but only for sites that still exist in SharePoint. The restored SharePoint site will be in the same location in the hierarchy as the original SharePoint site.

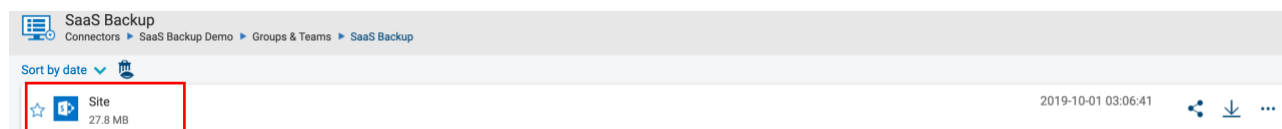
Teams Sites Moves to SharePoint

Team Sites are now found in the list of sites in the SharePoint folder. This change allows us to protect more data for Teams Sites.

A link to Teams Sites will still be found in the Groups & Teams folder. Selecting the link will take you to the SharePoint folder from where you will be able to browse and restore your data. The hierarchy of the team site will be the same as other types of SharePoint sites.

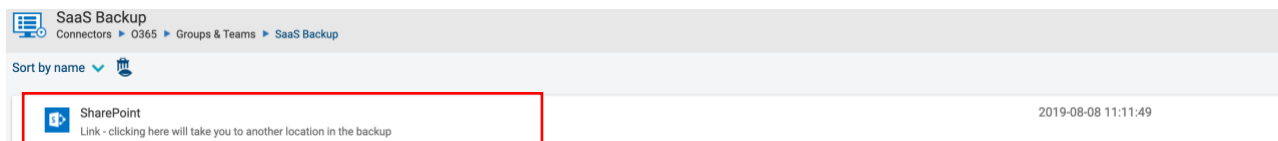
Please make sure to enable SharePoint backup so that your Team Sites data is backed up.

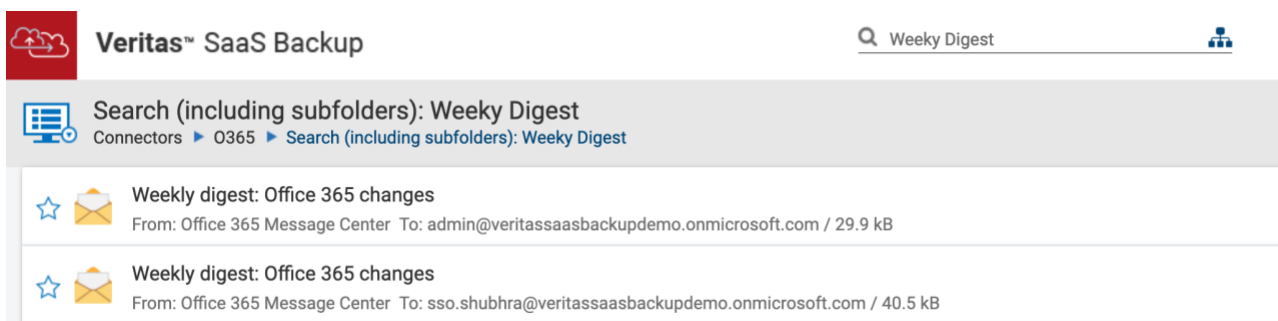
After the Change
