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i. If You use the Licensed Software on a Server with virtualization programs or virtual machine(s) installed, then the number of Processor Core(s) You would use to determine the number of SPVU licenses You must purchase for the Licensed Software is equal to the lesser of: (a) the number of virtual Processor Core(s) designated for use by each Instance of the Licensed Software; or (ii) the number of physical Processor Core(s) available on the Server.

ii. For example, if the Server on which the Licensed Software is installed has six physical Processor Cores and three virtual machines have been defined, such that each virtual machine has access to four virtual Processor Cores, You would have a total of twelve (12) virtual Processor Cores running on top of six physical Processor Cores. If only one Instance of the Licensed Software is installed on one of the virtual machines, the number of Processor Cores You will use to determine the number of SPVU licenses is the lesser number between the four virtual Processor Cores using the Licensed Software and the six physical Processor Cores that are available on the Server to all three virtual machines. In this example, the lesser number of Processor Cores is the four virtual Processor Cores.

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
